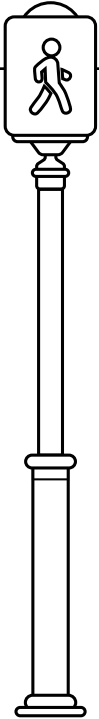




ROAD SAFETY SCAVENGER HUNT!

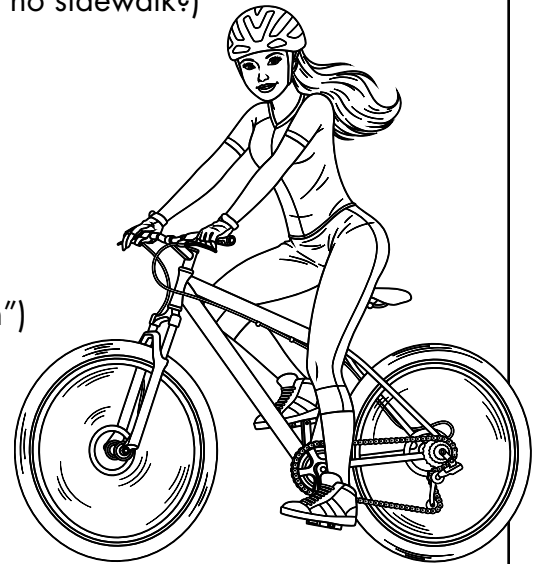


While out walking and getting some exercise and fresh air, why not make it fun (and educational!) with a road safety scavenger hunt! Suitable for kids in Grade 3 – 6. Feel free to modify for your walking route. Discuss the meaning of each item (i.e., traffic lights are for drivers, pedestrian lights are for pedestrians, walk/don't walk etc.)



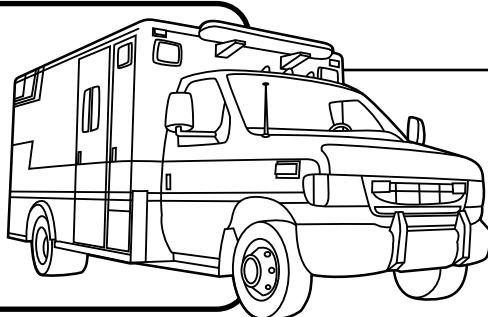
FIND THE FOLLOWING THINGS

- A visual barrier (something that blocks you from seeing drivers or drivers from seeing you).
- A traffic light
- A stop sign.
- A yield sign.
- A pedestrian light.
- A vehicle with its back-up lights on.
- A pedestrian cross-over.
- A crosswalk.
- A pedestrian doing something dangerous (i.e., listening to headphones, jay-walking, etc.)
- A driver doing something dangerous (i.e., rolling stop, talking on their cell phone)
- A street with a sidewalk.
- A street without a sidewalk (and what side should you walk on when there is no sidewalk?)
- Someone wearing something reflective.
- A cyclist on the street (considered a "vehicle")
- A cyclist riding on the sidewalk (considered a "pedestrian")
- A cyclist making a hand signal (i.e., turn right, left)
- A driver making eye contact with you.



BONUS!

An emergency vehicle (either hear the siren or see it)
